For better sensitivity when fishing with an artificial lure, hold your rod tip low and to the side, keeping the angle between rod and line at about 90 degrees.

Rayjus Outdoors—Oak Lawn High School Bass Tournament


On October 13, 2012, <u>Oak Lawn Community High School</u> and <u>Rayjus Outdoors</u> hosted the <u>Rayjus Outdoors-Oak Lawn High School Bass Tournament</u> on the Kankakee/Des Plaines River at the Des Plaines Conservation Area. Over 170 students from 23 high schools across northern Illinois took part in the event, making this one of the largest high school fishing tournaments in Illinois! The weigh-in was conducted by the <u>Illinois Bass Federation Nation</u> and **Unique Bassmasters**.

Competition between the 45 boats taking part in the tournament was fierce despite the cold, windy, rainy weather. Many kids fought the elements to catch their fish, but it was **Matt Caulfield** and **Jimmy Ciurej** of **Brother Rice High School** that took home the first place trophy. **Jimmy Cuirej** also caught the big bass of the tournament, which weighed in at 2.50 pounds!

Each of the 45 boats that took the kids fishing was given a bottle of Marine Formula Stabil that was provided by Gold Eagle and the Fishing and Outdoor Radio Show. The Bass Pro Shops (Bolingbrook, Illinois) provided weigh-in bags for all the teams as well as a framed art piece that was given to the big bass winner. Rayjus Outdoors provided "goody bags" filled with products from Mercury Marine, Lake Fork Tackle, Power Team Lures, and Custom Cast Lures to the kids taking part in the event. moved on to an enormous weed flat. I cast towards the branch and on the second cast, I catch the first fish of the day, and it's a keeper.


After covering the area and not catching anymore fish, we ran down the river to the next spot. I quickly caught several shorts. As the

When we got back to that spot, again we caught nothing and went back to our first spot where I caught some more shorts and Andy caught one keeper. Time was running out and luckily, our last spot was near the boat launch and we fished till the last second in hopes of one more fish to no avail. After coming back and weighing our bag, we took eighth place out of 45 boats. It was an awesome experience.

Winterizing Your Fishing Gear By Hubert Wasilewski (grade 10)

Oh gosh! Look what time of the year it is once again. It's the middle of fall and a lot of you know what that means. That's right, its time to winterize your gear so it is ready for the spring time. A lot of you think that your gear will be fine and that nothing has to be adjusted, but you are wrong. There is always something to be tweaked. I believe the most important thing to check is your line. That is what connects you to the fish. If that line is frayed you must cut it off. I go fishing a lot and I know the line gets frayed so I change it every spring . If you put some fresh line on recently, you should spray some Reel Magic line conditioner. It will help your fishing line last longer.

You aren't done yet. The next thing you have to check are your guides. Now during the manufacturing of the rod they might have used to much cement to hold it in place and it cracked or the guide just slipped out of place. I had this happen to me a couple of times and its not that big of a worry. A simple fix is a small dispenser of super glue (which you should have in your tackle box) and just glue it back into place. And when you are done with gluing it back on make sure you cap the glue right or you might just glue it to your tackle box like I did.

Now to the fun part-the reel. It is one of those things that people don't always like to mess with but they have to. It's the only part on the rod that has so many moving parts. Before I do anything to the reel I always give it a simple cast or two to check how the gears are working and if I feel something wrong. If there is something wrong, I check to find the problem. You could get the gunk out of the gears with a brush or what I like to use is a compressed air can. You could get them at any Walgreens store and they come with a hose to fit in those tight spaces. Once you get all that out, just lubricate it and see how it feels. There is just one last thing to do to with your reel before you put it away and it's probably the most simple and important thing to do on your reel. You have to loosen the drag all the way because there is a little spring on the inside which controls that drag and over time it will stiff out and you will have to replace it and that's just a pain. So this saves you time so that means you could be at the lake longer. So in

this article, I have explained how to store, fix, and maintain your fishing gear for the long winter. Hope you enjoyed the article and hope you catch some keepers in the spring. Good luck!

Recipe of the Month: Baked Parmesan Perch

Ingredients


- 2 tablespoons dry bread crumbs
- 1 tablespoon grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 tablespoon paprika
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- 1 pound perch or fish fillets of your choice
- 1 tablespoon butter, melted



Directions

In a shallow bowl, combine the bread crumbs, Parmesan cheese, paprika and basil. Brush fish fillets with butter, then dip into the crumb mixture. Place in a greased baking pan. Bake, uncovered, at 500° for 10 minutes or until fish flakes easily with a fork. **Yield:** 4 servings.
