TERMS AND CONDITIONS RECOMMENDATIONS

MUSIC SOLO & ENSEMBLE CONTEST

1. Recommendation: III. E. 1. - Online Entry System (List of Participants)

The deadline for entering the "List of Participants: for Music Solo and Ensemble is

January 18, February 7.

Rationale: By moving the entry deadline to the Friday following the IMEC conference from January 18th to February 7th, we are not conflicting with the ILMEA conference and we are providing directors more time to secure their entries yet not impose a significant delay on host management duties and planning.

2. Recommendation: IV. A. 1. - Contest Event Fees for Solo

\$8.00 **\$10.00** per entry

Rationale: By increasing solo event fees to \$10. will assist sites in covering expenses and will align with other event fees. The last IHSA event fee increase for music solos was from \$6. to \$8. in 2001-02

3. Recommendation VIII. A. 3. - Approved Solo Events

Vocal

240. Female Voice Treble Solo

241. Male Voice Bass Solo

Rationale: This change aligns with gender neutral language in the rules book.

4. Recommendation VIII. B. 1. - Ensemble Events - Definition

Doubling on parts is not allowed in Percussion Choirs

Rationale: Doubling is permissible in all other choirs.

(*Note Page 9 – also needs edited*)

5. Recommendation: VIII. B. 2. B. - Vocal Entries

A school shall be limited to twenty (20) vocal ensembles. Maximum entries in Events Nos. 150-152 = total of twenty (20). In addition, a school may <u>three vocal choirs</u>. <u>enter one (1) Madrigal Group (Event No. 153)</u> and one Chamber Choir (Event No. 154). Total maximum vocal ensembles <u>and choir</u> entries = twenty-two <u>three</u> (22) (23).

Rationale: By striking the language that outlines the genre of required vocal choirs, directors can bring three vocal choirs of their choice.

6. Recommendation: VIII. B. 8. - Approved Ensemble Events

Please note that doubling of parts is permitted in instrumental events. 8, 9, 10,16, and 18, and vocal events 150, 151, 152, 153 and 154 (nor permitted in Handbell or Percussion Choirs). Doubling of instrumentalists is not to exceed two per part.

Rationale: Instrumental ensembles can double in parts. This aligns with what is currently allowed in choir. However, no more than two students can be on a part.

(*Note: review in adjudication training*)

7. Recommendation: Orchestra S & E scales – Return to the 2018 scales.

Rationale: After a trial year with updated scales, the committee recommends going back to the original orchestra scale requirements.

RULES B. ENSEMBLE EVENTS 2. Entries a. Instrumental

a. Instrumental: In instrumental ensembles a school may enter any number or combination of events within the following maximums:

9 ensembles Brass Percussion 4 ensembles 9 ensembles String Woodwind 9 ensembles Piano Duets 4 duets **Instrumental Choirs** 7 ensembles Flute Choir 1 choir Clarinet Choir 1 choir Woodwind Choir 1 choir **Brass Choir** 1 choir Percussion Choir 1 choir Bell Choir 1 choir String Choir 1 choir

Total Maximum Instrumental Ensemble

Entries: 42 ensembles

MUSIC ORGANIZATIONAL CONTEST

1. Recommendation VIII. A. - Number of Participants

8. Jazz Choir: 10 8 minimum; 32 maximum

Rationale: Currently, the minimum number of students allowed to compete in a Jazz Choir is 10. In the past, vocal Jazz Choirs in schools thrived with 12 or more members. We have seen a decline in the size of these groups with many being less than 10. By lowering the minimum number of participants for a Jazz Choir from 10 to 8 we will provide an opportunity for school to enter this event that previously could not enter because they could not meet the current minimum.

2. Recommendation: VIII. B. 3. Chorus (page 6)

Each chorus shall perform at least two (2) selections with a minimum time of seven (7) minutes and a maximum time of twelve (12) minutes.

Rationale: Most songs performed are between 2 ½ and 3 ½ and a half and 3 and a half minutes so this contradicts itself. I would suggest either taking out the suggested 2 songs or remove the seven-minute minimum

3. Recommendation VIII. B. 4. b. Show Choirs/Jazz Choirs (page 6)

It is recommended that two (2) selections of varying styles be performed <u>Jazz choirs must meet a minimum</u> performance time of seven (7) minutes and a maximum performance time of twelve (12) minutes. Jazz Choirs must include one "swing-style" (unequal division of the beat) selection in their program.

Rational: The current terms and conditions state for Jazz Choirs that two selections should be performed with a minimum time of seven minutes. Most songs performed during contest will be between 2 1/2 and 3 1/2 minutes, therefore this language is contradicting. Directors can use any selections to meet the 7-12-minute time allotment.

4. Recommendation: VIII. B. 4. h.

Jazz Choirs will not be evaluated on choreography. Judges are to use the rating scale without choreography on the adjudication form. Jazz Choirs will be judges primarily on the musical performance of the group. Improvisation or Creativity/Musicianship of soloists will also be a eategory for evaluation

Rationale: Adjustments needed to be made on the jazz choir adjudication form to better reflect solo performances in this category.

(Note: On the actual adjudication form, remove continuity of performance – replace with musicianship from the instrumentals jazz adjudication form).
