Sectionals (8) on Tuesday-Wednesday & Friday, February 28-29 and March 2

Super-Sectionals (4) on Tuesday, March 6

State Final on Friday-Saturday, March 9-10 at Carver Arena, Peoria Civic Center, Peoria, Illinois

Class 3A & 4A

In each class:

Sectional Complex: Regional Quarterfinal games, Monday, February 27

Regional Semifinal: Tuesday-Wednesday February 28-29

Regional (32) championship games, Friday, March 2

Sectionals (8) on Tuesday-Wednesday & Friday, March 6-7 and March 9

Super-Sectionals (4) on Tuesday, March 13

State Final on Friday-Saturday, March 16-17 at Carver Arena, Peoria Civic Center, Peoria, Illinois

Advancement:

Team winning each regional advances to correlated four-team sectional. Team winning sectional advances to correlated super-sectional. Team winning each super-sectional game advances to semifinal round of State Final Tournament.

How Pairings are Determined (Class 1A & 2A)**Geographic Regionals**

By IHSA Policy, all teams entered in the Boys' Basketball Class 1A & 2A state series shall be assigned to one of thirty-two (32) geographic regionals.

Seeding Meetings

Seeding Meetings will be conducted on-line for each of the thirty-two (32) regionals in each class. Schools participating in the seeding process will be allowed one (1) vote. Information regarding the specifics of the seeding process is available in the Boys Basketball Manual for Schools.

Creating Regional Pairings

The teams assigned to each regional tournament will be paired according to their over-all seed following the on-line seeding meetings.

Creating Sectional Pairings

Prior to the start of the state tournament series, a blind draw will be held at the IHSA Office to determine the sectional pairings. The regionals feeding into each sectional will be arranged alphabetically by the standard IHSA name and assigned one of the letters A, B, C, or D. The blind draw will then determine which regional winners will meet in the sectional semifinals.

Super-Sectionals

Correlated sectionals are assigned to send winner to pre-selected super-sectional site on basis of geography.

How Pairings are Determined (Class 3A & 4A)**Standard Sectional Complex (Class 3A and 4A)**

By IHSA policy, sectional complexes in the Chicago land area will be structured as listed below. For the purposes of this policy, the Chicago land area has been defined as the area on the IHSA Chicago area map. In these sectional complexes, the sectional tournament shall be set up so that the semi-finals will pair the winners of the regionals with the numbers 1 & 4 seeds in one game, and the winners of the regionals with the numbers 2 & 3 seeds in the other game.

Sectional Complex Divided into 4 Geographic Regionals

In Class 3A and 4A, schools will initially be assigned to one of eight sectional complexes. Once assigned to a sectional complex, schools in sectionals that lie substantially outside of the Chicago land area will be assigned to geographic regionals. The number of schools assigned to each of the four regionals within a sectional complex will differ by not more than one.

Prior to the start of the state tournament series, a blind draw will be held at the IHSA Office to determine the sectional pairings. The regionals feeding into each sectional will be arranged alphabetically by the standard IHSA name and assigned one of the letters A, B, C, or D. The blind draw will then determine which regional winners will meet in the sectional semifinals.

Seeding Meetings

Seeding Meetings will be conducted on-line for each participating school's first level assignment (geographical regional or sectional complex) in each class. Schools participating in the seeding process will be allowed one (1) vote. Information regarding the specifics of the seeding process is available in the Boys Basketball Manual for Schools.

Creating the Regional Pairings

The teams assigned to the regional tournament will be ordered according to their over all seed and then paired accordingly. For example, in a six-team tournament, the winner of the game between the number 4 and 5 seeds would play the number one seed, and the winner of the game between the number 3 and 6 seeds would play the number two seed.

Super-Sectionals: Correlated sectionals are assigned to send winner to pre-selected super-sectional site on basis of geography.

State Final: By blind draw in IHSA Office.

State Final Tickets

Regional: \$4.00 per person

Sectional: \$5.00

Super-Sectional: \$8.00*

*At venues hosting two Super-Sectional games on the same evening, the ticket price shall be \$10.00

State Finals: Tickets for the Class 1A, 2A, 3A, and 4A Boys Basketball State Final Tournaments at Carver Arena, Peoria Civic Center will be priced according to seat location. Location of seats set aside for followers of the teams advancing to the state final tournament(s) will be modified to reflect the ticketing arrangement. The price of tickets for seats will be at three levels. Season ticket packages will be made available for advance purchase first to IHSA member schools and then to the general public.
