# Wheelchair Basketball

## Who

Students in elementary and secondary school in Illinois who are eligible and interested in wheelchair basketball are welcome to contact someone listed on the contact list for further information. Students who are new to the sport or unsure if they are eligible to play are welcome. All students who participate in wheelchair basketball must be able to push a manual wheelchair.

## Eligible

Students who are eligible to play wheelchair basketball are not just those who use a wheelchair on a daily basis. Others who might be eligible include students with orthopedic impairments, permanent knee injuries, leg length discrepancies and also those students with lower extremity weakness, spinal cord injuries spina bifida, cerebral palsy, multiple sclerosis, traumatic brain injury or amputation. Students who are unable to participate in able-bodied basketball may be eligible to play wheelchair basketball. Parents, coaches, officials, administrators and other interested individuals are also more than welcome to get involved in wheelchair basketball



## What is Available For Athletes

Clinics are provided each year sponsored by the Illinois High School Association.

These clinics are facilitated by Coach Mike Frogley, Head Coach of the University of Illinois Men's and Women's Basketball Team, and/or athletes and assistant coaches from the University of Illinois wheelchair teams.

These clinics will be listed on the ihsa web in late September. Area teams conduct full schedules during the winter months. A list of teams and contact person is included.
