2013-2014 IHSA CROSS COUNTRY RULES MEETING INFORMATION/BULLETIN

INTRODUCTORY NOTE: This bulletin has been prepared to give you a quick study guide for the upcoming Cross Country Season. Complete information will be included in the Terms & Conditions and the Manual for Schools on the IHSA Cross Country Website. **The Following Information** deserves your special attention. If you have questions about official interpretations or recommendations for rule changes for next year, please email IHSA Assistant Executive Director Ron McGraw (<u>rmcgraw@ihsa.org</u>).

It is important to make sure your Schools and Officials Center is up-to-date with contact information. Significant changes have been made to the IHSA School Center. Please double check:

Coaches: Each Cross Country coach will be issued a unique password through their High School Administration. The school will need your valid email address to issue the password to you. If you are receiving emails and your school is not going to participate in the Cross Country State Series, this is a "Red Flag" that the IHSA believes that your school is entered and planning to participate. To avoid penalties, you must have your official representative withdraw your school by emailing toraig@ihsa.org by the Online List of Participants deadline.

Officials: Login to the Officials Center to make sure your email address is current.

This information is required for IHSA to effectively communicate with its coaches and officials. If you are receiving notifications from our office, please do not ignore them. You are receiving communications because you are entered into the state series and we require/expect for you to meet all deadlines to remain eligible.

NOTICE:

One Girl's Coach and one Boy's Coach per school (<u>Teams and Schools with Individual Entries</u>) and any Cross Country official must review the complete online rules video and follow the instructions at the conclusion of the presentation to get credit for a Rules video. Each year schools and officials are required to review the Rules video presentation to prevent a probation or suspension status. The Online Girls & Boys Cross Country Rules Video begins August 13 and will be closed on September 10, 2013.

IHSA Track & Field Officials that wish to work as a CC Official must not only review the online rules video, <u>but</u> <u>must also complete the online examination for CC officials</u>. There are no additional fees or additional registration. As in the past, the IHSA Track & Field officiating license is the license required to work as a Track & Field AND Cross Country official. The Online Girls & Boys Cross Country Rules Exam begins August 13 and will be closed September 10.

NOTICE:

The IHSA has committed to providing an avenue for participation for IHSA member school athletes with disabilities in cross country. The details concerning this program will be released to the IHSA Web Site as they develop.

NOTICE:

Remember, all schools entered in all IHSA sports will be required to view the online rules video. All entered schools must have each head coach view the online rules presentation in their IHSA School Center.

	If your school is listed on the Regional/Sectional Assignments and your school will not be competing in the IHSA Regional/Sectional Competitions, send an email to tcraig@ihsa.org and indicate your school needs to withdraw from Cross Country. Sometimes prior Principals or Official Representatives will enter your school before the end of the prior school year without knowing how many kids will go out for your program in the fall. Check on your IHSA status with your school representative.

II. PROCESS FOR RECEIVING CREDIT FOR VIEWING ONLINE RULES VIDEO

<u>A coach representing each school</u> and officials should login to the IHSA Each coach must use their 2013 unique password issued by your school administration to access the IHSA School and Officials Center. Remember that a **password is required** to enter these secure areas. Once there, select the link to "find meeting, redeem credit." At the end of each video, coaches and officials will automatically be given credit for watching the rules meeting video.

Schools: To receive credit for the Cross Country Online Rules Video: A coach from each boys and girls program must review the Rules Meeting Video between August 13 and September 10, 2013. Schools that do not redeem credit for the Rules Video within this time period will either be placed on Probation or Suspension and must pay a penalty fee to get the probation or suspension lifted. It is a requirement that all cross country coaches take the few minutes necessary to refresh themselves with the IHSA cross country rules and procedures.

Officials: To receive credit for the Cross Country Online Rules Video: You must login to the IHSA Officials Center between August 13 and September 10, 2013. If a track and field/cross country official chooses not to participate and receive cross country credit, they will simply not be included in the list of eligible officials that will be used by member schools in the IHSA Cross Country State Series. Officials not participating will in no way affect their status this spring as a track & field official. It is our hope that **all** track & field/cross country officials will take the few minutes necessary to refresh themselves with the IHSA cross country rules and procedures.

Below are a few options to assist you in viewing the Rules Meeting presentation once you have tried and have failed.

- a) Try again on a different computer, preferably in a different location (home instead of school, etc.) Sometimes these files download badly. Going to a different computer/location is the easiest way to get a fresh start. Our software is not capable for giving credit for people using a tablet or IPad.
- b) Go back to where you clicked on the link to start the presentation, and INSTEAD click on the link below to view the LITE version, which has no video content. Flash video can be an issue for some computers, and the lite version takes this out of the equation.
- c) Do not use a tablet or IPad for viewing Rules Meetings. Our software is not capable for giving credit for people using a tablet or IPad.

III. 2013-2014 NFHS Track and Field and Cross Country Rules Interpretations/IHSA Terms and Conditions changes.

IHSA T&C VII-A

In Classes 2A and 3A, only the top six (6) teams will advance from the regional to the sectional meet. It is the opinion of many that since the implementation of three classes in cross country, the regional level of competition has not been competitive at many sites due to the small number of teams that actually appear to compete at regional meets. With some regional sites having only 8 or 9 schools assigned and in several instances only 5 actual teams competing, it takes very little to qualify on to the sectional level of the state series. However, this is not the situation across all classes nor is it true across the entire State. It is not logistically practical to eliminate the regional level of competition due to the lack of appropriate facilities required to conduct meets the size of IHSA sectional meets. One option could be to reduce the number of teams allowed to qualify from any regional meet from 7 teams to 6 teams. This option was seriously considered last year but no action was taken at that time as the committee preferred to wait and collect more data and consider the question again at this year's advisory meeting. This year the decision was made to make this change in 2A and 3A.

IHSA/NFHS Rule Variations: These variations are well documented in the IHSA required online Rules Video. Officials, please review the online rules video prior to taking the required part I online examination.

1. **Uniform – In Illinois** the uniform and undergarments worn by cross country teams and track and field RELAY TEAMS must be <u>SIMILAR, NOT IDENTICAL</u>.

Undergarments do not need to be of a single, solid color and need not be unadorned. An athlete may wear multiple undergarments and those undergarments may be of different colors, For example; it would be legal to wear a red long sleeve tee shirt with a green short sleeve tee shirt over it. In cross country and on T&F relay teams only, if more than one team member chooses to wear undergarments ,then his/her undergarments must be similar in style and color. In the example above, any team member also choosing to wear undergarments would also need to wear the red long sleeve and the green short sleeve tee combination. Not all of the team members would be required to wear undergarments, but if they do, then they must match in style and be similar. COACHES, in order to guarantee that the officials interpreting your teams uniforms share your interpretation of "SIMILAR, it is highly recommended that you make certain that your cross country team members and T&F relay teams match exactly. Again, this is recommended and not required. Obviously if they match exactly there is no need for an officials interpretation.

The uniform rule in Illinois is interpreted to provide some flexibility for schools under the pressure of tight budgets. When interpreting uniforms for cross country teams and track and field relay teams consider the following: Are the uniforms being worn similar enough so that a person standing at the finish line can easily determine that the competitors running for the same school are team mates? Ultimately, this is a judgment call that will be made by the meet referee, common sense should prevail.

- 2. Watches In Illinois it is not legal to wear a watch during competition.
- 3. Chips vs. Torso In Illinois we determine the finish order of competitors by the position of the torso and NOT the order provided by chip timing when video is used to determine places.
- 4. Uniform/Jewelry DQ In Illinois we do not disqualify a competitor for a uniform or jewelry violation after they have passed through the clerks inspection and are racing or have finished their race (unless alterations are made after the competitor passes inspection. In this case they would be disqualified for unsporting conduct).
- 5. **Removable Arm Sleeves –** Are <u>legal</u> in Illinois.
- 6. Calf Sleeves Are <u>legal</u> in Illinois.
- 7. Wrist Sweat Bands Are legal in Illinois.

IV. Steps for Coaches at Participating Schools To Enter and Remain Eligible to Compete In IHSA Regional, Sectionals and the State Final

This list of steps can be used as a guide for coaches and administrators. This guideline is an attempt to help keep schools and/or its participants eligible to compete in the Cross Country State Series. It is not intended to replace the Terms and Conditions or the Manual. To be fully informed, you must **read the Online Manual for Schools on the IHSA Cross Country Website**. **PLEASE DO SO!**

A. What: Enter school into the Cross Country State Series

Who: Principal or Official Representative When: By September 6 Where: IHSA.org How:

- 1) Go to <u>www.ihsa.org</u>
- 2) Click on IHSA Schools & Officials Center Login
- 3) Enter your User ID (5 digit ID, a letter followed by 4 letters) and Official Representative or Principal password
- 4) Click on Submit School Entries
- 5) Click on Activities

6) Click on Girls and/or Boys Cross Country

Why: This is how the IHSA knows the school wishes to participate in the Girls and/or Boys Cross Country State Series.

B. What: Review the Online Manual for Schools

Who: Coach and/or Athletic Director

When: Mid August

Where: The Manual for Schools will be posted on the respective IHSA Cross Country Activity Page: How:

- 1) Go to <u>www.ihsa.org</u>
- 2) Click on "IHSA Sports & Activities"
- 3) Click on Girls or Boys Cross Country
- 4) In the Resource Section, Click on the "Manual for Schools"

Why: This is how the coaches and athletic directors learn what is necessary in order for their athletes to participate in the Girls and/or Boys Cross Country State Series. Failure of coaches and athletic directors to become familiar with these details often results in the student athletes and/or coaches from their schools being denied the opportunity to compete.

C. What: Online Rules Video Presentation for Girls and Boys Cross Country

Who: All schools entering cross country must have each Head Coach view the online rules video. By-Law 2.120 requires schools entering a sport as teams or individuals must view the online rules video

When: Available August 13, 2013 through September 10, 2013. A \$50.00 penalty will be assessed after the deadline and placed on probation the first year and/or suspended the second year for failure of redeeming credit for online rules video.

How:

1) Go to <u>www.ihsa.org</u>

- 2) Click on "School & Officials Center Login"
- 3) Enter your User ID (5 digit ID, a letter followed by 4 digits) and your boys or girls Cross Country Coaches password as assigned by your schools administration through the IHSA Schools Center.
- 4) Click on "Rules Video" next to Girls or Boys Cross Country
- 5) View the online Rules Video to receive credit.

Why: This is a yearly requirement for ALL SCHOOLS ENTERING CROSS COUNTRY (TEAM OR INDIVIDUAL)

D. What: Entering Participants into the State Series Meets: "Online List of Participants" Who: Coach

When: Deadline is Noon, October 22 - If a school does not submit their Online List of Participants by the deadline, coaches and/or participants from that school are subject to sanctions, which could include but not be limited to being ruled ineligible to compete in the State Series. Schools which do not do so and are consequently ruled ineligible for the State Final Series and must email tcraig@ihsa.org a letter indicating they are withdrawing from the Cross Country State Series by noon on the day of the Online List of Participants deadline or a \$100.00 penalty will be assessed to your school.

Where: <u>www.ihsa.org</u>; click on School & Officials Center Login; enter your Enter your "User ID" (5 digits, a letter followed by a number) and the password issued to you by your school. All of this information was emailed to you by your school. (Boys and Girls Coaches have different passwords); click on List of Participants and type in all the required information.

How:

1) Go to www.ihsa.org

- 2) Click on "School & Officials Center Login"
- 3) Enter your "User ID" (5 digits, a letter followed by a number) and the password issued to you by your school. All of this information was emailed to you by your school. IHSA login ID and your unique Cross Country Coaches password (Boys and Girls Coaches have different passwords), issued through your school administration through the IHSA Schools Center.
- 4) Click on the "List of Participants" link
- 5) Type in the requested information and save your page(s).

Why: This is how the IHSA knows the names of the participants and coaches. This information will later be used in the State Final Program. It will be used as it is presented so please double check spellings for accuracy.

Reasons for the "Red Box" to appear in the Sport/Activity Tracker:

- Schools would not verify to have competed in at least 6 Contests (team honors only).
- School hasn't checked the "Sign-Off on Form" page.

Verification of IHSA Receiving List of Participants:

- Print a copy once you have completed the Sectional entries. This is your verification and if necessary, you can provide proof of your entries at the Coaches Meeting, in case of computer or file download error (very rare).
- Make sure you click on the "SIGN OFF ON FORM PAGE" so you will not receive unnecessary reminders from our ••• office about not receiving your List of Participants.

Once the process is complete and the deadline date approaches, the Schools Center Activity Tracker will show that the deadline has passed. This does not mean your school didn't complete it. It means the IHSA Office has imported all rosters and is in the process of preparing the files for the Sectional Managers.

After completing and submitting the Online List of Participants, print out a copy of the completed List of *Participants* for your records. You will not have access to this page, if you try to print it after the deadline.

E. What: Withdrawal from the Cross Country after being entered

Who: Principal or Official Representative When: Prior to Noon, October 22 Where: IHSA Office

How: Email Tammy Craig (tcraig@ihsa.org) a letter indicating the desire to officially withdraw.

Why: Schools that fail to participate after entering and who fail to formally withdraw will be fined \$100.00 (additional penalties may apply, refer to Terms and Conditions). The fine is necessary to encourage schools to make us aware of their intent not to participate. When schools do not show up it adversely affects the balance in the numbers of teams assigned to each Regional and/or Sectional. This can create situations that are unfair to others. When you become aware that your school will not participate in the State Series, please withdraw immediately!

I. **TERMS AND CONDITIONS RECOMMENDATIONS:**

VII. A – Advancement of winners 1.

Recommendation:

Advancement from regional to sectional:

In class1A shall be the first seven (7) teams and five (5) individuals not members of the first seven 7 placing teams will advance to the sectional competition at the site to which they were assigned.

In classes 2A and 3A shall be the first six (6) teams and five (5) individuals not members of the first six (6) placing teams will advance to the sectional competition at the site to which they were assigned.

Rationale:

There is an opinion by some that since the implementation of three classes in cross country that the regional level of competition has not been competitive. With some regional sites having only 8 or 9 schools assigned and in several instances only 5 actual teams competing, it takes very little to qualify on to the sectional level of the state series. However, this is not the situation across all classes nor is it true across the entire State. It is not logistically practical to eliminate the regional level of competition due to the lack of appropriate facilities required to conduct meets the size of IHSA sectional meets. One option could be to reduce the number of teams allowed to qualify from any regional meet from 7 teams to 6 teams. The IHSA staff is open to changes but such changes will only be possible in the near future with the help of those already proficient in the use of current technology and hy-tek software. The IHSA is very interested in acquiring the necessary technology and expertise to allow the use of more common methods of team entry and reporting of results.

The committee reviewed and discussed all comments and suggestions sent to Ron McGraw. Many ideas were discussed and considered during the meeting. All items that received a motion and a second from our group were voted on by the committee members.

- A. Revise the State Series to increase the number of 1A sectionals by one.
- B. Reduce the congestion at the starting line (both in front and behind) to help schools with their run s.

outs.

- C. Keep the final results of the state final meets a secret until they are revealed at the awards area.
- D. The IHSA clothing vendor ran out of t-shirts for a 2A patron.
- E. Increase the stipends for host schools to off-set the cost of chip timing being used at meets.

VI. Officials Information

State Final Officials:

Officials Uniform (the same for T&F)

- 1. A starter's sleeve must be a solid color: red, yellow or orange.
- 2. White or red collared shirts, short or long sleeved.
- 3. Blue, black, khaki or gray pants, no jeans or sweat pants.
- 4. Blue jacket with a red, yellow, or orange sleeve customized to the coat, or a plain blue jacket with a separate starter's sleeve.
- 5. Blue or red sport coat may be worn, tie is optional.
- 6. If not acting as the starter or referee, wear apparel provided by the meet management or white shirt with pants as in No. 3.
- 7. Officials patches must be worn according to VI-A patches in the current IHSA Sports Officials Handbook.
- 8. Additional State Final Officials Patches can be purchased by logging in to the IHSA School & Officials Center. The cost is \$2.00.
- Major officials are licensed with the IHSA. Only IHSA Athletic Officials licensed in Track and Field/Cross Country may serve member schools as major officials at boys and/or girls interscholastic cross country meets. (Major officials include the Referee, Starter, Referee-Starter).
- In the interest of providing a fair competition it is highly recommended that a host school NOT contract a member of their coaching staff to serve as a major official for their state series cross country meets.

VII. REGIONAL/SECTIONAL HOSTS, CROSS COUNTRY COACHES AND/OR ATHLETIC DIRECTORS INFORMATION

- Prior to a cross country meet, the competition area, facilities and equipment must be inspected and prepared in
 adherence to proper safety measures that insure the safety of competitors, officials, coaches and fans.
- Regional and Sectional Managers are required to use the Computer Data File supplied by the IHSA Office for use in identifying eligible competitors for these important Regional/Sectional Meets. Managers should not request participant information from schools assigned to their Regional/Sectional and schools should not respond to such a request of a Regional/Sectional Manager to provide participant information. The IHSA develops and maintains the "official entry list", and only those athletes listed are eligible to compete.

Accepting athletes names from any other source will likely result in the illegal participation by an ineligible athlete. These situations are always negative, emotional and must be avoided.

- Video Replay and Television Monitoring Equipment: Use of video replay or television monitoring equipment other than the official equipment approved by the IHSA (or meet manager) shall not be used to make decisions related to the state series meets. Only IHSA state meet officials, including the games committee (when called upon by the meet referee to do so), will have the authority to review official video results. It is also required for the host to have available a finish line camera for the purpose of "required official video review" at all regional and sectional meets. Video review will be used as the primary method of determining the outcome of all races at the regional, sectional and state final meets. The Meet Referee and IHSA officials will review the finish line video of each regional, sectional and state final race to facilitate accurate scoring of each race.
- At regional and sectional events elaborate, multi-camera systems are not necessary. A single, <u>well positioned</u> camera should be satisfactory. Host schools must consult the meet referee to determine the appropriate position and angle of the finish line camera.
- Regional/Sectional Video Review: The host school conducting all regional and sectional events must provide some form of video review of the finish line. This video review can be as simple as one video camera and one monitor (television or computer, etc.) or as sophisticated as the host school chooses. Placement of this camera is critical. Please consider its placement (height, angle, etc.) carefully. Meet managers must consult the Meet Referee as the decision regarding camera placement is considered. Only the video of the meet management may be used to review the finish of any race. The Meet Referee will review the video of the finish of race to facilitate accurate scoring of each race. Only the referee and meet management may view the finish line video (the games committee may also view the video, but only if invited to do so by the meet referee).
- Meet managers are required to provide Ron McGraw with a set of complete results of their regional and sectional meets. This information may be emailed or faxed to the IHSA office.
- Meet managers must have the following items available:

At least one (1) Licensed IHSA Track & Field/Cross Country Official is <u>required</u> to serve as the Official Starter/ Referee (as for all cross country meets during the IHSA season per IHSA by-law 2.080).

(a) stop watches or other appropriate timing system

- (b) starting device
- (c) flags to mark the course

(d) properly designed starting line (starting boxes measuring between 4' and 6' wide)

(e) properly designed finish line (implement the minimum 15'wide mouth chute as used at the state finals; see the IHSA Cross Country Managers Manual for diagrams).

(f) Video camera to capture the finish (minimum of one required; limited to use by the IHSA official(s) and meet management).

(g) Copy of the current IHSA Terms and Conditions, IHSA Managers Manual and the latest edition of the NFHS T&F/Cross Country Rule Book (it will be from the previous school year).

(h) A reliable method of keeping track of the order of finish.

VIII. IHSA State Meet Clerking Details

The following tables present the details used by the Clerks of the Course at the IHSA State Cross Country Meet to check in competitors for the six races at the State Meet in a timely manner with a minimum of disruption to prerace preparations.

IX. SPORTSMANSHIP

- 1. It is important that everyone involved in the Girls and Boys High school Cross Country programs work together to teach, instill, promote and support GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP among the student-athletes, coaches, officials, athletic administrators, school administrators and spectators.
- 2. Showing support and cheering for your own team, as well as showing appreciation for the good performance of your opponent(s), does much to promote good sportsmanship.
- Competing by the rules is important in establishing and maintaining good sportsmanship. Adherence to the "spirit" of the rule as well as the "letter" of the rule gives student-athletes, coaches, officials, athletic directors, school administrators and fans a "winning edge" in achieving good sportsmanship. THE RULES NEED TO BE FOLLOWED AND ENFORCED, REGARDLESS OF THE TIME OF THE SEASON AND THE SKILL LEVEL OF THE COMPETITORS.
- 4. (4-6-1 & 2) Sportsmanship is a priority with the Illinois High School Association and the National Federation. This rule clearly states that, "No team personnel/competitor shall act in an unsporting manner..." "Team personnel" is interpreted to include coach(es), competitors, non-competitors, lap counters, managers, etc.

Art. 1: Unsportinging conduct is behavior that is unethical or dishonorable. It includes, but is not limited to, disrespectfully addressing an official, any flagrant behavior, intentional contact, taunting, criticizing or using profanity directed towards someone. This shall apply to all coaches, contestants and other team/school personnel. **Penalty**: Disqualification from that event and further competition in the meet. Disqualification of a coach or other school personnel shall be from further involvement in the meet.

Art. 2: Unacceptable conduct by a competitor includes, but is not limited to, willful failure to follow the directions of a meet official, using profanity that is directed at someone or any action which could bring discredit to the individual or his/her school.

Penalty: Disqualification from the event.

a.) If a member of the "team personnel" is ejected from the competitive area for unsportsmanlike conduct, officials should make sure the ejected member of the team personnel is under the direct supervision of authorized school or security personnel. If a coach is ejected from the competitive area (or the premises) and there is no other authorized school personnel available to coach the team, the meet will be forfeited to the opponent(s). The meet referee should report the ejection of a coach from the competition area to the school principal and the IHSA Office on the **Special Report Form**.

5. **SAWA Reports:** Officials should only send in SAWA Reports in extreme positive cases of Sportsmanship. Sawa Reports should not be sent to the IHSA Office, just because a school ran a good meet, etc. Please use good judgement when sending those reports to the IHSA Office.
