A Bill to Solve the Pension Problem

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE ILLINOIS GENERAL ASSEMBLY HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1. Payments received by individuals from state government retirement		
3	plans shall be taxed as regular income under income tax laws. Illinois Income Tax Act		
4	Section 203 (a)(2)(f) is hereby repealed.		
5	SECTION 2. State government retirement plans shall be defined benefit plans as		
6	defined by the Illinois Pension Code, 40 Illinois Compiled Statutes (ILCS) 5. The Illinois		
7	Income Tax Act is defined as 35 ILCS 5.		
8	SECTION 3. The Illinois Department of Revenue will implement and oversee this		
9	legislation.		
10	SECTION 4. This bill shall take effect at the beginning of Fiscal Year 2019.		
11	SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and

A Bill to Separate the Church and State

1	BE IT ENACTE	D BY THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	All religious organizations in the United States shall now be required to
3		pay property tax based on the county and state regulations and formulas
4		the property is located in.
5	SECTION 2.	Any religious organization that is defined as such under the Internal
6		Revenue Code section 501(c)(3) will be subject to this tax.
7	SECTION 3.	The Internal Revenue Service will be in charge of implementation and
8		oversight of this bill. Churches that donate 80% of more of their income
9		to registered charities will be exempt from the property tax requirement.
10	SECTION 4.	This bill shall go into effect on January 01, 2019.
11	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Incentivize Electric Vehicles

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	ARTICLE I	Owners of all electric vehicles shall be granted subsidies including but
2			not limited to: access to less-congested traffic lanes, reduced income
3			taxes by 15%, and removal of sales taxes for the vehicle purchase.
4		ARTICLE II	In effort to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, the United States will
5			implement a 50% tax on all gasoline. Money collected will go towards
6			providing these subsidies.
7	SECTION 2.		"Electric vehicles" shall be defined as cars which run solely on
8			electricity without gasoline. This does not include hybrid vehicles.
9	SECTION 3.		The United States Department of Transportation shall oversee the
10			implementation of this legislation.
11	SECTION 4.		This bill shall take effect January 1 st , 2019.

A Resolution to Let the Rising Sun Bring its Guns Out

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	WHEREAS,	North Korea and China have increased their military capabilities
2		within Southeast and East Asia; and
3	WHEREAS,	Japan is now at a greater threat of attack than at any time in the
4		past; and
5	WHEREAS,	Article 9 of the Japanese Constitution prevents the development of
6		a Japanese Army, Navy, or Air Force; and
7	WHEREAS,	The Treaty of Mutual Cooperation and Security between the United
8		States and Japan mandates that the United States acts as the
9		defender of Japan in place of a Japanese military; and
10	WHEREAS,	The United States holds several major military bases within
11		Japanese territory including bases in Okinawa and Shiuoka
12		Prefecture; now, therefore, be it
13	RESOLVED,	The United States Congress recommends that Japan shall amend
14		their constitution to remove Article 9.
15	FURTHER RESOLVED,	The United States shall slowly phase out presence in Japan to
16		remove 50% of bases across Japan and reduce military personnel
17		by 50% across Japan by 2023.

A Bill to Reform Our Immigration System

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1.	The executive program known as Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals,
	or DACA, is hereby authorized and funded. The Department of Homeland Security
	will report to Congress on what is needed to continue to extend DACA protection
	to people living in the United States.
SECTION 2.	The Department of Homeland Security is directed to accelerate existing paths to
	permanent residency and/or citizenship. The DHS shall reduce current wait times
	by 50% by 2020; additional budget requests from DHS to meet this goal will be
	honored.
SECTION 3.	The travel moratorium most recently requested by the President will be authorized
	by this act and implemented by the Department of State.
	A. Any funding necessary to implement this travel moratorium will be granted the
	Department of State.
	B. The Department of State will submit a report to Congress on the effectiveness
	and necessity of the travel moratorium three months after the passage of this bill,
	and Congress will decide at that time if the moratorium will remain in place.
SECTION 4.	This bill shall take effect immediately upon passage.
SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Tailor Education for the Future Generation

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1.	All Illinois public school districts will have to provide families the choice of	
3		which school they want to attend by providing school vouchers. Every	
4		Illinois public school will also transition to magnet schools within 5 years	
5		of the implementation of this bill.	
6	SECTION 2.	Illinois public schools will be defined as schools funded and maintained	
7		by the government. School vouchers will be defined as sums of money	
8		given to public schools when students enroll. Magnet schools will be	
9		defined as schools that specialize in certain career clusters, teaching	
10		styles, or academic needs.	
11	SECTION 3.	The Illinois State Board of Education is responsible for the regulation of	
12		this bill.	
13		A. Monetary value of school vouchers will be determined by taking	
14		Illinois's education spending budget and dividing it by the amount of	
15		public school students.	
16		B. Schools will still have to follow Illinois State Board of Education	
17		Graduation Requirements as well as Illinois Learning Standards	
18		C. Schools will not be able to discriminate or deny enrollment based on	
19		race, sex, gender, sexual orientation, religion, income status, disability	
20		or academic history	
21	SECTION 4.	This bill shall go into effect August 1, 2018	
22	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

1	SECTION 1.	The United States shall hereby adopt smart gun technology
2	in all public m	narkets.
3	SECTION 2.	Smart gun technology is defined as technology that provides
4	a safety featu	ire allowing the firearm to fire only when activated by an
5	authorized us	er. This technology includes RFID chips, mechanical locks,
6	fingerprint re	cognition, and/or magnetic rings that will be incorporated
7	into each fire	arm.
8	SECTION 3.	The United States Consumer Product and Safety
9	Commission	will be provided with \$25 million to expand oversight to
10	include smart	gun technology, which must be in every firearm within the
11	United States	i.
12	A. The Unite	d States Consumer Product and Safety Commission will
13	implemer	nt a recall program to ensure that faulty smart gun systems
14	and guns	without smart technology will have properly functioning
15	systems a	s outlined in Section 2.
16	B. This prog	ram will end in 2024.
17	C. Non-com	pliant gun manufacturers will be fined at 200% of the original
18	retail of t	he firearm, per firearm sold. This money will be placed toward
19	extra fund	ding for the legislation.
20	SECTION 4.	This bill will be implemented in fiscal year 2018.
21	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared
22	null and void.

A Bill to Advance Our Students

1	BE IT ENACTE	D BY THE ILLINOIS GENERAL ASSEMBLY HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	All Illinois high school students must complete 1 full credit of an
3		accredited AP course with a passing grade in order to graduate.
4		Exemptions are available for individual students with disabilities or
5		cognitive delays.
6	SECTION 2.	1 full credit shall be defined as either 1 full year or 2 nonconsecutive
7		semesters of an AP class. An accredited AP course shall be defined as any
8		course that has successfully completed the College Board's AP Audit
9		process. A passing grade shall be defined as a grade of a C or higher. An
10		exemption must be filed with the Illinois State Board of Education and
11		will be granted at their discretion.
12	SECTION 3.	The Illinois State Board of Education will oversee the implementation of
13		this bill.
14	SECTION 4.	This bill will go into effect beginning with the Class of 2022.
15	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Limit the Tariffs to Create Better Foreign Relations

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1. SECTION 1.	Tariffs on imports from other countries shall not exceed 20% on the
2.	overall trade.
3. SECTION 2.	A tariff shall be defined as any tax on imports from another country. Trade
4.	shall be defined as any exchange of products for other products or a
5.	money value.
6. SECTION 3.	The Department of Commerce shall oversee the enforcement of this bill.
7. SECTION 4.	The implementation of this bill shall take place on June 1, 2019.
8. SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this bill shall hereby be declared null and void.

A Resolution to Pop the Poppy Plant

Be it resolved by the United States Congress here assembled that:

1	WHEREAS,	The opioid epidemic has plagued the United States and countries around the
2		world, and drug trafficking is at an all-time high; and
3	WHEREAS,	These opioids cause the United States to lead the world in drug deaths, with
4		poppy plant-derived drugs leading to many of them; and
5	WHEREAS,	More than 67 thousand people died from opioid abuse and overdose in
6		2016; therefore, be it
7	RESOLVED,	That the United States Congress here assembled direct the USDA Foreign
8		Agricultural Service to develop and assist other nations' agricultural departments
9		in regulating the sale of the poppy plant and all of its biological parts as well
10		regulating the cultivation of the poppy plant itself.
11	FURTHER RESOLV	ED, This resolution shall also seek assistance with various
12		organizations including the United Nations and NATO to help similar drug
13		epidemics worldwide and help pass a similar legislation throughout
14		partnering countries.

A Bill to Support the Right to Work

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1. The National Labor Relations Act and the Railway Labor Act shall be
3	amended so that provisions that permit employers or labor organizations to require
4	employees to join a union as a condition of employment shall be removed.
5	A. Such requirements are now considered unfair labor practices under the National
6	Labor Relations Act.
7	B. Existing contracts with these provisions shall be allowed to stand without penalty
8	for two years after the passage of this bill, and then must be modified or be
9	subject to prosecution under the Act.
10	SECTION 2. Amendments to the National Labor Relations Act include relevant
11	portions of 29 U.S.C.157, 29 U.S.C. 158(a), 29 U.S.C. 158(b), and 29 U.S.C. 158(f).
12	Amendments to the Railway Labor Act shall include section 2, paragraph 11.
13	SECTION 3. The Department of Labor and the National Labor Relations Board will
14	implement and oversee this legislation.
15	SECTION 4. This bill shall take effect at the beginning of Fiscal Year 2019.
16	SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
17	void.

A Bill to Reform Net Neutrality Regulations

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:			
2	SECTION 1.	A. Internet service providers (ISPs) shall be prohibited from engaging in		
3		throttling, blocking, zero rating, or paid prioritization.		
4		B. The Federal Communications Commission shall permanently reclassify ISPs as		
5		information services.		
6		C. Federal Trade Commission antitrust and privacy regulations shall apply to ISPs.		
7	SECTION 2.	"Internet service providers" shall be defined as companies that provide		
8		customers Internet access and related services. "Throttling" refers to an ISP		
9		slowing down access to an online service. "Blocking" refers to an ISP barring		
10		access to lawful Internet content. "Zero rating" refers to an ISP exempting online		
11		services from data limits on phone or Internet plans. "Paid prioritization" refers		
12		to an ISP receiving payment from a content provider to allow customers faster		
13		access to the provider's websites and services. "Information service" refers to		
14		the definition of the term under the Communications Act of 1934.		
15	SECTION 3.	The Federal Communications Commission shall enforce Sections 1.A and 1.B. The		
16		Federal Trade Commission shall enforce Section 1.C.		
17	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2018.		
18	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

2	SECTION 1.	The United States will officially and formally ratify the Rome Statute of	
3		the International Criminal Court treaty.	
4	SECTION 2.	The United States federal government will follow all Constitutional	
5		provisions of treaty ratification to become an official member of the ICC.	
6		The United States will follow all legal provisions outlined by the United	
7		Nations as a party to the treaty.	
8	SECTION 3.	The Department of State will oversee the implementation of this bill.	
9	SECTION 4.	This bill shall go into effect on January 01, 2019.	
10	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Dismantle Pyramid Income

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
SECTION 1.	No employee of any business shall earn annual compensation of more than 100	
	times the salary of the median employee salary of the business.	
SECTION 2.	A business shall be defined as a commercial or not-for-profit operation that	
	employs individuals. Annual compensation shall encompass both monetary and	
	non-monetary pay. This includes salary, stock options, and other forms of	
	payment. The median employee shall be defined as the person who makes the	
	median annual income of a business.	
SECTION 3.	The Wage and Hour Division of the United States Department of Labor shall be	
	responsible for the implementation and enforcement of this bill.	
SECTION 5.	This bill shall take effect starting fiscal year 2019	
SECTION 6.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Promote One Person, One Vote

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1.	In order to protect the right to vote, each state shall establish an	
3		independent, nonpartisan Voter Protection Commission (VPC) to draw,	
4		or, if necessary, redraw, and evaluate the Congressional districts in that	
5		state.	
6	SECTION 2.	A. The VPC shall draw the districts so that each district is optimally	
7		compact, contains roughly equal population, and respects Census blocks.	
8		B . A Census block is the smallest geographical unit used by the Census	
9		Bureau.	
10		C . To evaluate redistricting, the Department of Justice shall use the	
11		criterion that the number of representatives elected should roughly	
12		equal the percentages of the popular vote.	
13	SECTION 3.	The Department of Justice shall implement this legislation.	
14	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall take effect upon passage so that redistricting is in	
15		place for the 2018 midterm elections.	
16	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
