


By-law Compliance Checklist

By-law	Who is responsible to check	How it is done by your school
Recognition certificate State Board of Education		
By-law 1.270 Approved schools may only be scheduled for dual events (no tournaments)		
3. By-law 2.030 All co-op schools must have proper paper work filed with the IHSA

1.270 – Approved School Only





Scenario 2.080- It's game night. Your JV volleyball team is just finishing pre-game warm-ups, fans are in the stands and the visiting team is ready to play. However, the IHSA licensed officials have not arrived. You run to your office and call the contact number listed on the contract and no one answers.



Scenario - IHSA By-law 2.080 pg. 35. With mutual consent by both competing schools; coaches or staff can officiate the non-varsity level contest.

2.080 SELECTION AND USE OF LICENSED OFFICIALS

All major officials for athletic contests must be licensed with the IHSA in the sport the individual is to officiate, except that in the event contracted officials do not appear for a contest below varsity level, and with mutual consent by all competing schools, members of the coaching staff, faculty, and/or administrative staff of any of the competing schools may officiate the contest. The Board of Directors shall be responsible to establish policies and procedures governing the licensing process.

The names of game officials for each interscholastic athletic contest must be submitted by the host school to the visiting school not later than five school days before such contest and must be mutually agreed upon not later than the night preceding the contest.



Scenario 3.106: You are informed by your boys track & field coach that five days after the first track & field practice, one of his track & field athletes competed with his non-school track & field club, The Racing Rockets, in a non-interscholastic meet that was not sanctioned by any state or national governing body. In addition, this athlete receives private, one on one, instruction from his non-school club coach (the legend himself, Coach Blaze McDuffy) both during the IHSA track and field season and outside of the IHSA track and field season. Coach McDuffy is not a coach at a member school.


Do these situations constitute an IHSA violation? If yes, what would your next step be?



Scenario 3.106 Answer: According to IHSA By-laws 3.106 and 3.112.2 neither of these situations constitute a violation. Although participating in non-school competitions while that IHSA sport is in season is a violation, IHSA By-law 3.106 provides a window of seven days to cease non-school participation after the athlete's school conducts its first tryout or practice in that sport.

Additionally, 3.112.2 allows for students to attend coaching schools, camps, or clinics during any time of the calendar year as long as no person who is a coach at the student's school is involved in any respect.





Non-School Competition Participation Requests

submit NSCP request

This form is provided to request approval for participation in a non-school competition while on a school team in the sport in question.

IHSA By-law 3.101 prohibits a student from participating on a non-school team or in non-school competition in the sport or any skill of a sport at the time the student is a member of a school team in that same sport. During the school term, special permission may be granted to permit a student to compete in a non-school event during the school season in competitions which are directly sanctioned by the national governing body for the sport or its official Illinois affiliate. No student may participate in more than three (3) approved non-school competitions during a sports season.

This form is to be completed and submitted online no later than ten (10) days prior to the date of any competition for which a student seeks an exception to the restriction of By-law 3.101. It must be accompanied by the required written verification from the National Governing Body for that sport or its official Illinois affiliate indicating it is directly sanctioning the event.

Scenario 5.042- Your boys basketball coach approaches you about his plan for Friday night. He has invited the cross-town rivals over for a preseason scrimmage before the first game of the season.



New Administrator Workshop

• Scenario 17 Answer- You inform your coach that this is not allowed. IHSA by-law 5.040 does not allow contests prior to Monday of week 21 and the IHSA defines any interscholastic competition, including a scrimmage, in which students representing two or more high schools participate with or against each other as a contest.

5.040 BOYS BASKETBALL

5.041 Season Limitation

- a. No school belonging to this Association shall organize its Boys Basketball teams, practice or participate in interscholastic contests earlier than Monday of Week 19 or later than Saturday of Week 37 in the IHSA Standardized Calendar.
- b. A member school may conduct its first interscholastic contest in Boys Basketball no earlier than Monday of Week 21 in the IHSA Standardized Calendar.

59) SCRIMMAGE AS CONTEST

- Q. Is a scrimmage considered to be a practice or an interscholastic contest?
- A. If a scrimmage involves exclusively students from one high school, it is considered to be practice. If a scrimmage involves students from more than one high school, it is viewed to be an interscholastic contest and is subject to all rules pertaining thereto. (Constitution 1.420 & By-law 2.090)

Fall Baseball

•Scenario Policy 38 - Joe Stevens is part of the Teutopolis Fall Baseball team who ends their fall season on October 1st. The soccer team had a number of injuries this fall and is short on numbers. Joe is a good athlete and could help the soccer team. Is Joe allowed to join the soccer team at Teutopolis? If so, when can he compete in a game?



Fall Baseball

•Scenario Policy 38 - Assuming the team will practice every day but Sunday. Joe will be eligible on October 11 per Policy 38 which requires Joe to complete 9 practices prior to his first game.

Minimum practices:

Each athlete must complete a minimum number of practices prior to competition

- Cross Country, Girls Volleyball, Girls Swimming, Boys Soccer: 9 practice days
- Girls Tennis: 7 practice days
- Football: 12 practice days
- Golf will be exempt from the Heat Acclimatization Policy

115) MORE THAN ONE SPORT

- Q. May a boy or girl participate on more than one school athletic team (such as golf and football) at the same time?
- A. Yes. (By-law 3.050)
