### **PROTOCOLS & RULES**

**Adviser Role** Reminder that the advisers role in Sectionals is to help relay any technological issues that may occur to the IHSA, and to gather and submit their students' work upon completion. Students should compete independently. Advisers should not offer any advice, review work, note errors, etc. once the competition has begun.

**Competitors:** Students may compete from anywhere with internet access. Competing at your school is recommended if possible.

**Equipment/Software:** There are no limitations on the programs or software students may use to complete the design categories, this includes using their online yearbook software. If using a site like Canva, they must begin with a blank document as opposed to a template from the program. Microsoft word or a similar word processing program is recommended for writing events. Work will be submitted as PDFs in all applicable categories. Students & advisers are responsible to make sure that students have the proper equipment and software they require to compete in their respective events.

**Rules:** All rules for each event are provided in the prompt and will be updated to reflect any subtle changes for the virtual format (i.e. the equipment/software mentioned above). Applicable prompts will also note that all info must be from the prompt and no further information may be gathered from the internet. Failure to adhere will result in disqualification.

**Prompts:** Prompts will be posted on the Sectional Web Page at the start of the block and disappear at the deadline. Students will also be emailed a PDF of the prompt.

**Submitting Work:** Advisers are responsible for submitting their students' work via Google Drive. Each adviser will be sent the Google Drive link via email.

**Trouble Shooting:** The IHSA will have a Microsoft Teams meeting ongoing live throughout the State Finals. Advisers will be invited to that meeting. Students will be directed to let their adviser know if they have any issues during the competition. Should troubles arise, advisers should first try to alert the IHSA via the live Teams meeting.



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**Games Committee:** A games committee will be formed consisting of five randomly selected advisers. The games committee may be called upon to review and vote on disqualification in the event of plagiarism or other issues.
