## **DIRECTIONS & RULES**

A team of one to three students will provide their own equipment to record, edit and create an electronic video file of a news package that is at least 90 seconds long, but can be no longer than 120 seconds. Students shall be judged on the effective use of audio and video to engage their audience and tell the story. Interviews may be conducted in-person or via a virtual format like a Zoom meeting or similar service.

Each story must end with: "Reporting from Abraham High School, this is (reporter's name) with TV16."

Please make all your captions/fonts on your video use "Abraham High School." For example:

"Bill Johnson, Abraham High School Principal"

"Sally Johnson, Abraham High School Sophomore"

We recognize that interviewees may reference the actual name of your high school when you talk to them, as opposed to Abraham High School and that is ok. You do not need for them to change the school name when talking.

Please follow the timeline for this event:

April 6 at 9:30 AM: Competitors receive this prompt and story subject.

April 6-10:	Competitors may conduct interviews, shoot
	b-roll video and edit their story.

April 9 at 1 PM Students must submit the story by 1:00 PM.

# SUBMITTING YOUR WORK

For example: YouTube, Vimeo, etc. When uploading your video, please do not put your actual high school name in the title. Your video title should include the text "IHSA Sectional Video", your single digit Sectional number, and four-digit school code.
