#### Shoreline Salmon Fishing Tips by John Neubauer (grade 9)

On September 20, Mr. Jerry Flaherty from Fish Tales Fishing Club came to OLCHS and gave the Spartan Fishing Team tips on salmon fishing. First, he talked about the location. Each fall, these fish migrate into the Chicago harbors. The purpose of their migration is to spawn, then die. The King Salmons life span is only about four years. Since salmon do not reproduce naturally in Lake Michigan, they migrate into the harbors that they were stocked into as small fish by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources.

Next, he discussed lures. Spoons, crankbaits, and spawn sacks all work great. Nightcrawlers may work occasionally, but if you are going to fish with a bobber, spawn sacks are the way to go. When fishing with a bobber you do not need to cast it 50 feet out, you only need to cast these lures along the wall or within a few feet of the wall because these fish swim around the harbor following these walls. He then went on to explain that the fish are not eating your bait because they are hungry, but instead it is a reaction bite.

A medium action spinning rod and a spinning reel is

#### Burnham Harbor Trip by Andrew Jensen (grade 9)

We arrived at Burnham Harbor after school on Friday, September 30 around 5:30pm. It was very windy out, so I was not sure if it would effect the fishing. Soon after we arrived, it began to rain. The rain only lasted for about five minutes.

Fishing at Burnham Harbor was tough. Fishermen were basically shoulder to shoulder. It seemed like a lot of people from across Chicago were trying to take advantage of the fall salmon run. This trip required parents to drive us and fish with us and there was a lot of kids who came with their parents.

There wasn't really any action while I was there, and water clarity wasn't very good. Even though the water in the harbor was flat calm, it was cloudy. I've been at Burnham to salmon fish before, and I remember seeing schools of huge salmon cruising through the water like torpedoes. It's a sight to see, but that wasn't the case on this particular night. We saw a couple of guys catch fish, but on this night, the Spartans ended up empty handed.

I was casting a variety of spoons, but I didn't get a single hit. Coach Kuchyt had a hit and he said he had a big salmon follow his lure up to the wall. We did see one guy who left with a nice 30-inch king from earlier in the day. I was talking with another group of guys who were using salmon sacks and they said that they were catching them in the early morning hours.

It's always a good time to get out on the water with your friends. It's even better when you can do it at night under the lights of the Chicago skyscrapers. Even without any fish, it was still a great time!



perfect for salmon. The longer the rod, the better. Also, because of the strength of these fish, Mr. Flaherty recommended 12lb test Berkley Trilene line. He advised not to set the hook like a bassmaster at the Classic. He said a slow steady pull will get the hook set in their boney mouths.




The last piece of advice he offered were the numerous fishing spots at Burnham Harbor. He said if there was a steady north wind, to fish near "the pipe." The pipe is in the very back of the harbor. The fish come in and out of that pipe and relate to the current. He said that if you cast into this area you are likely to get a bite.


It was great to have Mr. Flaherty come in and share his

fishing tips. Hopefully we'll catch some fish using the tips he shared with us.


















#### Musky Fishing on Lake Shabbona by Carlos Patino

It was a GIANT! My first musky was about 38 inches in length and weighed about 11 pounds. On Saturday, October 8, 2011, the Spartan Fishing Team headed out to what some call the musky capitol of Illinois—Lake Shabbona. Our goal on this trip was to catch the fish of 10,000 casts.

A number of parents joined us on this trip. In all, the team rented eight boats. Team members whose parents could not join us fished from shore. Those kids who were fishing from shore caught smallmouth and largemouth bass.

The hunt for the big one started just before 8am. My dad and I had rented a boat for half the day. We fished all over the lake. The guy we rented the boat from suggested a number of spots on the map he gave us. Each spot on the map had a number. We fished from marker 5 to 14 and 18 to 23 with no luck. At that point, I was getting frustrated and I thought I wasn't going to catch a musky. I checked the time and noticed that we only had about an hour and a half left. I then asked my dad if he wanted to go back to the dock or keep fishing. He told me that he thought marker 18 was a good spot and we should give it a second chance. So we went back towards marker 18. Before we got there, we decided to stop at marker 14 which was a weedline. I casted the same bait I had been using for most of the day, a black and silver rattle trap. On the 6th or 7th cast I had one on! It was so strong that it forced me to bring my rod down and put it in the water. It took about a minute to get it close to the boat. Once it was about three feet from the boat I asked my dad to get ready to net it. Once I said the word "net" the fish spit the hook and swam away! It was a musky, only about 17" in length.

Not to be deterred and with a bit more motivation, I kept casting. On my second cast after the one I had lost came the GIANT ONE. I set the hook as hard as I could and the fight was on. I knew it was a giant because I didn't get to see any movement on top of the water for about 4 minutes I had to let it run for a little cause my rod was at the point of snapping. The fish went under the boat about two or three times and I had to walk all around the boat to keep the fish on. After five or six minutes of fighting it, it finally came close to the boat and we netted it.

Fishermen say that the musky is the fish of 10,000 casts because they are so hard to catch and it takes that many casts to catch one. I must have gotten lucky that day...
