# A Lesson Learned While Fishing By Michael Pajor (Grade 9)

Mike was asked by his English teacher to write a paper about a lesson he once learned. This is what he wrote...

It was a chilly summer morning in Wisconsin with me, my friend, and our dads. The moist air coming from the cold river woke us all up. It was 5:30 in the morning and we all sat down for breakfast. I was very eager to catch a fish, so I grabbed my pole and went down to the dock. I waited a few minutes until my friend came and then we went to the bait store. The bait store was a mile away. It was worth the walk because I was very excited about going fishing. We hurried to the bait shop.

The bait shop was very small and by the river. When we came up to the door it was locked and nobody was there. There was a note on the door that said to call a phone number. We called the number and the person who answered said the store was opening in a hour. We had to walk all the way back to the house. The whole time we were walking, we felt very disappointed so we went by the water. We starting throwing rocks in the water. After a while, we got cold, so we walked back to the house. The walk seemed a lot longer to get back to the house.

When we got back we saw our parents fishing. They had

already caught four medium sized fish. I asked my Dad, "Where did you get the bait?" He answered," I bought it last night." I then asked," Why didn't you tell us you had bought bait?" They answered," Because you didn't eat breakfast when we told you to." We apologized," We're sorry we will wait next time." Everyone laughed together.



Afterward we all started fishing. It was a clear cool day. We casted our poles and were catching a lot of fish. Some fish were caught in twenty minutes, some in ten minutes, and some were even caught in less than five minutes. We were very surprised on how many fish we had caught. Since we had a special fishing rig we could catch two fish at a time. In fact, I had caught two fish multiple times! There were tons of very large fish caught as well. We continued to fish for ten hours. When the day was over we had caught over forty-five fish.

The lesson I learned from this fishing trip is to be patient. It took over ten hours to catch the fish and it was a waste of time trying to buy bait. Most of all, I learned to listen to my parents.

# A Fish Report Card

A laboratory test in the mid 1980s showed the learning curves of popular game fish. In the experiment, researchers measured how long it took for specific species to learn to avoid an electrical shock. Here are some of the highlights:

- A The striped bass was the class brain, ranking at the top in tests.
- A- The lowly carp also got good grades. It ranked second to the striped bass,
- **B** Channel catfish wasn't far behind the striped bass and carp. A pretty good learner.
- C Largemouth rated worst among bass. Smallmouth was first followed by the spotted or Kentucky bass.
- D And you wondered why the bluegill bites so readily. It came close to flunking out.
- **D** The **northern pike**, for all its aggressive tendencies, doesn't learn from its mistakes.
- F The yellow perch was the class dunce, ranking dead last. Researchers deemed the perch "untrainable."

# Spartan Fishing Team to Host Fall High School Bass Tournament

The Spartan Fishing Team is planning the third annual Spartan Bass Tournament to be held on the Kankakee/DesPlaines River at the <a href="DesPlaines Conservation Area">DesPlaines Conservation Area</a> on October 13, 2012. The team has partnered with Unique Bassmasters and Rayjus Outdoors to bring this event together. Over 120 high school anglers and 42 boats took part in the 2011 tournament, making this tournament one of the largest high school fall bass tournaments in Illinois. Last year's tournament details and results can be found <a href="here">here</a>.

The 2012 tournament will have a similar format to the 2011 tournament. Schools will be allowed to enter as many boats as they can get on the water with up to four kids per boat roster. This give an opportunity for freshmen and sophomores or more novice anglers to take part in a bass tournament. A shoreline creature tournament is also held for the kids who are waiting for their turn on the boat or are not on a boat. The number of boats in the tournament, however, is limited to the number set forth by the DNR permit. Entries will be allowed on a first come, first serve basis. More information on the tournament, along with registration forms, will be made available mid-August 2012.

# Mono vs. Fluoro vs. Braid...Which is Best? By Emmet Nugent (Grade 9)

When talking about fishing line, there are many things to consider. The main thing is what you are going to be fishing for and what bait you are using. There are three main types of fishing line-monofilament, fluorocarbon, and braid.

Monofilament line stretches and is effected by UV rays, which means you will need to change the line on your reel at least once a year. It also floats, which makes it ideal for top water lures. Fluorocarbon stretches very little and it sinks in the water, which is why a lot of anglers like to use it when crankbait fishing. Because it reflects light at the same angle water does, fluorocarbon is less visible to fish. Braid does not stretch and it is very visible to fish. It is the strongest type of line, made out of several different strands that are fused together. It is the strongest of the three types of lines, but does knots tend to slip when using this type of line.

The best choice of line for you depends on what you will be fishing for and how you are fishing. If you are using crankbaits, it depends on the lip. For crankbaits with a longer or deep diving lip, the best choice would be fluorocarbon as it is less buoyant. For crankbaits without lips, the best choice would be braid. It offers no stretch and enable the bait to be

ripped through the weeds. For jigs being dragged on the bottom, the best choice would also be fluorocarbon due to its lack of buoyancy. For spinnerbaits, mono would be your best choice, because if you have ever caught a bass on a spinnerbait you need the hook as deep as possible in as the tendency to lose a lightly hooked fish on a spinnerbait is much greater. When using a heavy swimbait, you would want to use a heavier test monofilament because the bait weights a lot and you want a more stretchy tendency for hooking a larger fish. For topwater lures, mono is best. This all seems like a lot to remember, but <code>BassMinder</code> has a great "line selection <code>guide</code>" that you can stick on you tackle box.

As for price, the least expensive would be monofilament and the most expensive is braid. Almost always, the stronger the line, the higher the price. When choosing line, it defends on you and your style of fishing. My recommendation to you is to have multiple rods with various lines so that you can always have the right tool for whatever fishing situation you are in. 



# Recipe of the Month: **Baked Perch**

- 1 lb of perch fillets (substitutable with other types)
- Cooking spray
- 2 Tbsp Italian style bread crumbs
- 1 tsp. parsley
- 1½ cup parmesan cheese
- ½ stick of melted butter

Preheat oven at 450°F. Spray baking pan with cooking spray. Create one layer of fillets on bottom of pan, covering the entire bottom. For the topping, mix bread crumbs, parsley, and parmesan cheese. Using a basting brush, spread melted butter on top of fish, and then spread topping covering all of the fillets. Bake fish for 12-15 minutes, depending on the size of the fillets; fish are done when they are white and flakey when tested with a fork.





Do Bass remember? What is your take on this guestion? Based on my research, it looks like they do! According to the Berkley Research Center, bass use many different thinking techniques to learn. A well know bass expert named Keith Jones states that "Bass learn in several different ways." Bass use four special techniques to remember things.

The first type of learning technique bass use is called associative learning. This is the same type of learning that we use, commonly known as trial and error. Dr. Jones writes in his book, The Scientific Approach to Catching More Fish, "the animal is taught to link two types of stimuli, such as a certaincolored light with an ensuing electric shock. Bass readily learn hese associations, both in the lab and in the field, although not as fast as some other species."

The second type of learning is called **habituation**. This means that bass become less scared of things after experiences. An example is when bass hear the boat motor for the first time they would get scared and swim away. When they keep hearing a boat motor almost every day they won't get scared anymore and stay put.

The third type of learning technique that bass use is called spatial learning. Spatial learning is the most important learning technique for bass. Bass learn how to move around their environment using spatial learning. According to a Dr. Jones study, bass in his lab have been tested to swim in an underwater maze and are able to reach a specific point. They are able to accomplish this task by using the spatial learning technique.

The fourth and final way bass learn is called prey images. This allows the bass to have the ability to develop and recognize their prey. This is how bass identify shad and crawfish as their prey. Dr. Keith Jones states "Given enough positive experience with a certain prey type, a bass will gradually come to actively seek out that specific prey. Prey species, for their part, often counter the bass's efforts by changing their signature stimuli, often through the use of camouflage." This statement shows that bass do remember and they use their intelligence to 9 hunt for prey they find easiest to hunt. Although bass remember things, it does not mean that all bass remember everything at the same rate. Just like humans, some of us

learn things quickly and some learn

slowly. Some bass are smarter than other bass and vice versa. Dr. Jones conducted a four year study in Illinois that had to do with the capture rate of large-

mouth bass. The average bass was caught twice a season, but some bass were caught up to sixteen times in a single season! In conclusion bass do remember things but not all of them remember things the same rate as others do.

# An Exciting 2012 Tournament Season!


