ITEMS OF GENERAL DISCUSSION:

The committee had the opportunity to view all items submitted to Kraig Garber. Listed below are the topics that received discussion from members of the committee.

- 2. IHSA administrator, Kraig Garber, provided a summary of the participation in the disabled division for all sports in which one exists.
- 3. IHSA administrator, Kraig Garber, provided an update on the status of the IHSA Road Race.
- 4. Special Olympics Administrator, Jen Marcello, provided an overview of Unified Sports offered in partnership with the IHSA as well as other Unified Sports offered by Special Olympics.
- 5. IHSA Administrator, Kraig Garber, provided information pertaining to a new Paralympic Swimming Classification opportunity that was provided by IHSA member school New Trier High School on September 6-7, 2019.
- 6. IHSA Administrator, Kraig Garber, gave an overview of the IHSA Accommodation Request Policy and Request Form. There was discussion pertaining to converting the accommodation request form to an electronic one.
