MINUTES OF THE IHSA FOOTBALL ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING December 8, 2022

The IHSA Football Advisory Committee met on December 8, 2022 at 10:00 a.m.

TERMS & CONDITIONS RECOMMENDATIONS

1. V. A. 2) Sites, Rankings, Pairings

Recommendation: After determining the 32 teams in each class, classes 1A-4A will be separated into two brackets of 16. Classes 5A-8A will be seeded 1-32.

Rationale: The committee understands the IHSA's geographic principle of assigning teams to state series tournaments. However, some schools already face long trips in the football playoffs with the current north/south bracketing in 1A-6A. Additionally, some schools travel long distances for football games in the regular season due to conference realignments or to play non-conference opponents.

The committee feels seeding classes 5A-8A in 1-32 brackets will add more excitement and interest to the football playoffs as teams advance through the bracket to determine a state champion, regardless of geography.

ITEMS OF DISCUSSION:

- 1. The committee discussed the playoff brackets for classes 1A-4A and the possibility of changing those classes to a 1-32 format.
- 2. The committee discussed a proposal to expand the current playoff format to include 48 teams in each class.
- 3. The committee discussed a proposal from the Mid-Illini Conference regarding a 3rd/4th place game in the IHSA playoffs.
- 4. The committee discussed the current and future status of 8-player football.
- 5. The committee discussed data related to public and private schools and their levels of success in the IHSA playoffs.
- 6. The committee discussed the by-law proposal related to 11 on 11 football in the summer. This proposal is currently on the ballot for IHSA member schools.
- 7. The committee discussed the by-law proposal that would allow schools to participate in a preseason scrimmage. This proposal did not make the ballot.
- 8. The committee discussed details regarding Quarterfinal and Semifinal plaques.
- 9. The committee recognized outgoing members Jay Mullens, Byron and Zach Zehr, Tremont.
